Recovery residence bridges from the past to the near future are the topic of this training. Doug Brush will review the foundation and GARR’s history. Dr Paul Early covers the ASAM Patient Placement Criteria then Beth Fisher will review proposed re-definitions of recovery residence levels for the ASAM criteria. The session ends with George Braucht reviewing recovery standards of care and performance measures.

Objectives: Upon completion of this workshop, participants will know how to: 1) discuss the evolution of recovery residences into quality service providers in Georgia, 2) illustrate the ASAM levels of care for accurate placement of clients and residents, and 3) discuss the GARR standards of care and performance.

Method of instruction: Panel discussion and lecture with PowerPoint, discussion.
